## **Students, Have You Applied for Admission to Your Major?**

Admission to the Major is a very important process in your academic program. Its purpose is to (a) to facilitate the preparation of your Official Degree Plan, (b) officially apply to the college/school of your academic program and (c) ensure that you are taking the appropriate courses. Beginning October 1, the University Advising Center will be taking applications for the 2008 Spring Semester. The deadline to apply is October 31. Eligibility requirements include: 2.00 Grade Point Average; completion of 32 semester hours; completion of designated Core Curriculum requirements and major's lower prerequisite requirements. Nursing, Nuclear Medicine, Athletic Training or Pre-Pharmacy students do not need to follow this process. Education majors are required to do a Pre-Admission to the Major.
