The Bachelor of Business Administration (B.B.A.) in International Business at the H-E-B School of Business and Administration is designed to provide a broad analysis of business opportunities abroad, as well as political climates, trade barriers, government incentives and trade practices.

Students enrolled in the B.B.A. in International Business program, other than international students who attend UIW on a student visa, are required to participate in either a semesterlong study abroad program or a short-term study abroad program for at least one week. Students may study abroad as soon as their second semester in their sophomore year.

The B.B.A. degree program offers a comprehensive and contemporary business education readying students to succeed in any number of fields. The business degree program also creates a strong foundation on which to develop field specializations. In addition to providing the technical skills necessary for a professional-level position, the ethical considerations of business are also emphasized. Rooted in the Mission of the University, the B.B.A. degree program prepares students to be principled leaders.
