Program Overview	The baccalaureate nursing program prepares a graduate who is a beginning generalist in the practice of professional nursing. The UIW traditional baccalaureate graduate is qualified to take a national exam to be licensed as a Registered Nurse (RN). Graduates are also prepared to pursue advanced education in specialized nursing fields. For nearly a century, UIW's nursing program has been a regional leader for nursing excellence and education.		
Career Opportunities	A career in nursing offers a multitude of opportunities to care for others and to serve the public. The supply of nurses today cannot meet the demand. Because of this, nursing graduates can expect to work immediately in a professional practice setting, often with greater benefits and salaries than ever before. Settings for practice continue to expand beyond the familiar ones of clinics, hospitals and schools. UIW nursing graduates are also employed in the military, public services, corporate wellness programs, and home care settings.		
Coursework	Traditional BSN students complete approximately three semesters of foundational prerequisite courses followed by five semesters of nursing coursework. Throughout the program, students develop skills in clinical reasoning, communication, interprofessional teamwork, and the promotion of safety and quality in health care.
