How To Apply to UIW

Step 1: Submit your application. (It's free!) Create a GoUIW account through uiw.edu/apply and submit your application. You can also apply using the Common App or ApplyTexas.

Step 2: Submit your high school transcripts. Transcripts can be emailed in PDF format to admissiondocs@uiwtx.edu or physical copies can be mailed to:

Step 3: Submit your SAT and/or ACT scores (optional). This year, submission of standardized test scores is optional. If you are submitting test scores, an official report must be received from the testing center. You can request your score be sent to UIW by listing our code when you register for the exam. (Our code for the SAT is 6303, and ACT is 4106.)

Step 4: Submit additional application documents (if applicable).

- G.E.D. scores. If you have achieved the General Equivalency Diploma, an official score report must be submitted.
- AP/Achievement or CLEP Test Score (if taken)
- Dual credit transcripts (if taken)

Step 5: Submit your FAFSA. Apply for financial aid beginning Oct. 1 each year to qualify for state, federal and university grants (UIW FAFSA code: 003578).

Freshman Scholarships

All first-time freshman students at UIW are automatically considered for academic scholarships of up to \$20,000 per year.

Freshman Academic Scholarships range between \$5,000 to \$20,000 per year, and are renewable for up to four years.

Transfer Scholarships

Transfer students who are completing their first undergraduate degree and who have completed at least 24 credit hours at an accredited university are automatically considered for academic scholarships as part of their application.

Transfer Academic Scholarships range between \$10,000 to \$15,000 per year, and are renewable for up to four years of undergraduate coursework.



Direct Admit Programs



UIW offers direct admit options for highly qualified first-time freshmen that lead to advanced degrees in nursing, pharmacy, physical therapy, optometry or osteopathic medicine.

Students who meet the qualification criteria when applying to UIW will receive an email invitation to the Health Professions Direct Admit program shortly after they are admitted. Students will be asked to elect which program they are interested in and to complete a survey. Responses are shared with the respective schools who interview and admit students at their discretion.
