


#### WELCOME TO THE UAC AT THE UNIVERSITY OF THE INCARNATE WORD!

Academic advising is an educational process that, by intention and design, facilitates students' understanding of the meaning and purpose of higher education and fosters their intellectual and personal development toward academic success and lifelong learning. (NACADA, 2004)

In cooperation with university faculty, the mission of the University Advising Center (UAC) is to assist students in discovering their abilities, values, interests and limitations in the context of higher education. We accomplish this by collaborating with students to develop effective decision making skills and realistic goals consistent with their career choices and the realities that they will encounter in the world of work.

The UAC serves as the primary advisor to undeclared transfer, transient and non-degree seeking students. Additionally, the UAC provides supplemental advising to declared transfer students, probation students, and any students needing additional help after meeting with their assigned faculty or professional advisor. Professional Advisors serve as the primary advisor for lower classmen and secondary advisor for upperclassmen within their discipline.

## TRANSITIONING TO A FACULTY ADVISOR

- Depending on your major, you will be assigned to either a Faculty Advisor or UAC Advisor, initially.
- If assigned to a UAC Advisor, you will be transitioned to a Faculty Advisor as you advance through your program.
  - While your UAC Advisor will still be available to help with general advising and registration questions, the
    relationship you have with your Faculty Advisor will be one of mentorship, focused more deeply on exploring your
    field of study.
- Once your advisor assignment has been completed, you will receive a notification via Cardinal Email.

## DEGREE & PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

- 120 credit hours
  - 43 hours of General Core Classes
    - Composition I, Composition II, History, Social Science, Mathematics, Philosophy, etc.
  - 36 hours of Upper Level classes (Junior and Senior level courses)
  - 45 credit hours institutional credit or residency hours to be completed at UIW
  - 45 hours of Community Service
  - Program specific requirements



## MATH PLACEMENT



- MATH Placement is based on ACT, ACCUPLACER, SAT, or TSI test scores
  - Minimum score met—students are registered in college-level math class
  - Minimum score not met—students will be placed in the developmental course, MATH 0320-Intermediate Algebra and required to earn a "C" or better before taking college level Math
    - Students may test out of MATH 0320 by completing ALEKS
       Placement, Preparation and Learning (PPL) program





## **DEGREE WORKS**








