

Understanding DegreeWorks Class Registration Schedule

Understanding Course Numbers / Class Level

1000 Level Courses

Classes with a course number that begin with a 1 are classified as "Freshman" level classes. These classes are designed with first year students in mind and cover the foundational concepts of a subject.

2000 Level Courses

Classes with a course number beginning with a 2 are considered "Sophomore" level classes. These classes are intermediate level courses and usually build upon the knowledge learned in a 1000 level class.

Understanding Course Numbers/ Class Level

3000 Level Courses

Classes with a course number that start with a 3 are classified as "Junior" level classes. These classes are considered upper division courses and tend to cover more program specific information.

4000 Level Courses

Classes with a course number beginning with a 4 are classified as "Senior" level classes. These classes are advanced classes that usually focus on a topic specialization, research or program specific information.

Understanding Course Numbers: Credit Hours

The second number in a course number is the number of credits that class is worth.

This is something to pay attention to especially when it comes to meeting financial aid requirements.

For Example:

If your student is planning to sign up for CHEM 2311 that class is a 3-credit hour course, but if your student signs up for CHEM 2111 this course is a single credit hour.



Prerequisites VS Corequisites

Pre Requisites are classes that your student must take before taking another class. This usually occurs for upper division classes as your student needs to understand the foundational knowledge before taking the specialization.

Example:

In order to take Calculus II your student must first take Calculus I.

Co Requisite classes are classes that have to be taken at the same time as another class. This usually occurs when your student has to take a lecture for a class accompanied by a lab.

Example:

In order to take the Organic Chemistry 1 Lab your student has to take the Organic Chemistry 1 Lecture at the same time.



Understanding DegreeWorks

What is DegreeWorks?

Degree Works is an app located in Cardinal Apps, or GoUIW, used to keep track of your student's degree plan. It houses the information of which classes your student needs to take, which classes your student has taken, which classes are currently in progress, and much more!

DegreeWorks is broken up into sections such as:

Core Classes, Major Specific Classes and classes needed for your student's concentration (if they have one).



Not Complete (Still Needed)

In Progress (Current Classes/ Classes your student registered for) Classes with a green check mark are classes your student has already completed.

Classes with a red circle are classes that your student still needs to complete.

Classes with a half shaded blue circle are classes that your student is currently enrolled in or registered for.

Advising Time and Registration Season

Advising Time is when all current students are required to meet with their Primary Academic Advisor to discuss their academic progress and plan courses for the upcoming semester. Your student will receive their Registration PIN at this meeting which is required to be able to register for classes.

Registration Season is when your Cardinal officially enrolls in their classes for the next semester.





How can you help your Cardinal?

Encourage them to:

Check their UIW email daily for information on scheduling their mandatory appointment with their Advisor.

Check their BannerWeb account for holds and contact the appropriate office immediately to get them cleared.

Students must clear any holds before their registration time opens. Even with a PIN, a hold will prevent registration.
