The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in Criminal Justice at the College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences at the University of the Incarnate Word is uniquely designed to develop a student's awareness and knowledge of criminal justice issues while at the same time meeting the University's mission of social justice. The Criminal Justice department offers courses that emphasize social equity, responsibility and empathy that help the student grow and develop academically and professionally.

Students who have graduated with a Criminal Justice degree from UIW will have taken many of the traditional criminal justice courses that are offered at other universities such as Criminology, Ethics in Criminal Justice, Law Enforcement, Corrections, Juvenile Justice, Research Methods and Statistics. However, a Criminal Justice graduate from UIW will have the opportunity to take courses that emphasize social justice issues that are generally not available, as a collective whole, at many other universities, such as: Victimology, Restorative Justice, the Death Penalty, Wildlife Crimes, Environmental Crimes, Women in Crime and Criminal Justice, Art Crimes and many other courses that fit into the university's mission of social justice.
