The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) in English at the College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences at the University of the Incarnate Word prepares students for graduate school, law school, and for numerous careers in the corporate world. To this end, advanced courses in Rhetoric and Technical Communication focus on practical applications to daily life and business.

Additionally, our thriving Creative Writing emphasis prepares students for M.F.A. programs and professional opportunities. We offer a wide variety of courses in professional and technical communication, literary analysis, and creative writing which can be tailored to complement the other interests of each student. The skills that students learn in our classes are not found elsewhere in that our courses focus on abstract critical thinking and problem-solving skills that prepare them for an increasingly complex and demanding world.

Students in the English program can contribute to and edit the acclaimed journal Quirk; participate in Sigma Tau Delta, the International English Honor Society, and INK: The English Club; and afford themselves opportunities to travel or study abroad.
