Pre-Law

The Pre-Law program is designed primarily to develop the skills necessary for success in law school, focusing on reading comprehension, analytical writing, and oral communication. Students of any major are encouraged to enroll in the Pre-Law Concentration, as the practice of law encompasses many elements of society and law schools continue to favor cultivating diversity in all of its aspects. The Department of Political Science offers a series of law-related courses designed to familiarize students with law and to develop the analytical skills necessary for success on the Law School Admissions Test (LSAT) and performance in first-year law classes, including research, writing, and public speaking. In addition to the courses for credit, the Pre-Law program hosts events and activities related to the practice of law, such as moot court competitions, Constitution Day, the student Pre-Law Society, participation in law school admission fairs and conferences, and presentations by members of the legal community.
