#### **Program Overview**

The Finance program at UIW has two tracks: Banking and Personal Financial Planning. The programs are designed to provide students the skills needed to become a part of the finance community and be successful in management positions within the banking and financial service industry, business firms, or governmental organizations. The Banking concentration looks to develop global and social leaders who can direct companies and institutions to new paths of financial and economic growth that spill out wealth to the whole community. The Finance program introduces students to the world of finance and its key concepts such as time value of money, asset valuation, personal finance, and risk and return. Finance classes are taught in a state-of-the-art finance lab designed to transport Wall Street to the classroom.

#### **Career Opportunities**

The Finance degree prepares students for a variety of positions in banking, financial counseling, insurance, investments, and various corporate positions. It provides students with an integrated program of liberal arts that includes a global perspective and an emphasis on social justice and community service.

#### **Special Programs**
