Bachelor of Arts in Human Resources

The purpose of this major in Human Resources is to prepare students for challenges in the workplace related to managing and developing people. This includes those interested in HR careers as well as those who desire to improve their ability to solve problems, improve processes, and enhance the effectiveness of people in organizations. In addition to developing competencies in key HR activities (staffing, training and development, performance management, compensation and benefits, legal compliance), the student will develop important skills in critical thinking, problem solving, technology, and business communication. The Society for Human Resource Management (SHRM) has acknowledged that the Bachelor of Arts in Human Resources degree fully aligns with SHRM's HR Curriculum Guidebook and Templates. The guidelines – created in 2006 and revalidated in 2010 and 2013 – are part of SHRM's Academic Initiative to define HR education standards taught in university business schools and help universities develop degree programs that follow these standards.

Major Requirements for a Bachelor of Arts in Human Resources:

* Transfer equivalencies as applicable to the CCAF Associate in Applied Science Degree are indicated below.

1. Completion of UIW General Education Core Curriculum (46 hours)

* All 15 hours of General Education will be transferred here, plus 3 hours of transfer credit from the CCAF degree plan

4. Electives Module (29 hours)

* Free elective hours. These can be transferring hours or a specialized course area. Program Electives and Technical Education can transfer in here as free electives.

5. Community Service Component

A total of 45 clock hours (non-credit) of Community Service are required for all baccalaureate degrees at UIW. Academic advisors discuss the options for fulfilling the community service requirement and the method for documenting the service.

6. Residency Requirement

Following SOC guidelines, completion of 25% (30 credit hours) of coursework at the University of the Incarnate Word for Baccalaureate degree programs.

7. Upper-Division Course Requirement

36 hours of upper-division course work (3000-level and above). These courses can be transferred in or taken at UIW.
