

# Bachelor of Arts in Organizational Development

The purpose of majoring in Organizational Development (OD) is to prepare students for challenges related to improving organizational effectiveness and efficiency by increasing the capacity for individuals, groups, and organizations to adapt to change. This includes those interested in becoming OD practitioners, as well as those desiring to learn approaches for introducing new methods or practices in the workplace, and in helping organizations solve problems and achieve goals. In addition to building a foundation in business/business management and developing competencies in key OD activities, the student will develop important skills in critical thinking, problem solving, technology, and business communication.<sup>1</sup>

## Major Requirements for a Bachelor of Arts in Organizational Development:

\* Transfer equivalencies as applicable to the CCAF Associate in Applied Science Degree are indicated below.

### 1. Completion of UIW General Education Core Curriculum (46 hours)

\* All 15 hours of General Education will transfer here, plus 3 hours of transfer credit from the CCAF degree plan

\* The 6 hours of Leadership, Management, and Military Studies will transfer here in Management Theory and Practice, Human Resource Management, or Organizational Behavior as applicable.

### 4. Electives Module (29 hours)

A total of 45 clock hours (non-credit) of Community Service are required for all baccalaureate degrees at UIW. Academic advisors discuss the options for fulfilling the community service requirement and the method for documenting the service.

### 6. Residency Requirement

Following SOC guidelines, completion of 25% (30 credit hours) of coursework at the University of the Incarnate Word for Baccalaureate degree programs.


### 7. Upper-Division Course Requirement

36 hours of upper-division course work (3000-level and above). These courses can be transferred in or taken at UIW.
