Award Amount: \$1,000

Application Period: Deadline is December 11, 2024

Eligibility Criteria: Open to parents, spouses, children, or siblings of U.S. military members who died while serving on active duty. The scholarship is for tuition or books at a college, university, or trade/vocational school.

The American Legion Legacy Scholarship is a needs-based scholarship designed to fulfill a financial gap remaining after all federal and state educational grants/scholarships available to an eligible applicant have been utilized up to \$20,000 for children of the fallen and up to \$5,000 for children of the disabled for undergraduate and post-graduate college. Recipients may reapply for additional annual awards up to six times.

Eligibility Criteria: Spouses of Veterans or Active-Duty members of the U.S. military, including the National Guard or Reserves, pursuing an undergraduate degree (no post-grads). AMVETS scholarships are designed to fulfill a financial gap after all Federal/State grants and/or scholarships available to an eligible applicant have been exhausted.

Applicant must be a 12th Grader entering college during the Fall Semester within the year of graduation. AMVETS scholarships are designed to fulfill a financial gap after all Federal/State grants and/or scholarships available to an eligible applicant have been exhausted.

Children of Fallen Patriots Foundation Scholarship

Award Amount: Average award of \$6,250 per year

Application Period: Rolling

Eligibility Criteria: Open to children of U.S. military service members who died in the line of military duty, during combat or peacetime. The scholarship covers costs related to undergraduate education: tuition, room and board, books, fees, living expenses, a one-time \$1,000 computer stipend. Students can be enrolled in either public or private institutions; colleges, universities and vocational schools are covered. We do not cover airfare to and from school, and funding cannot be applied to graduate-level education. This Scholarship is meant to bridge the gap in funding between available sources of grants and scholarships (i.e., VA Chapter 33 or 35, federal, state, local and private grants) and the total cost of college.

Defense Commissary Agency Scholarships for Military Children

Award Amount: \$2,000

Application Period: December 15, 2024 - February 15, 2025

Eligibility Criteria: Unmarried dependent children under the age 23 who possess a valid Uniformed Services Identification (USID) card, with a minimum 3.0 GPA. Applicants must be enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time undergraduate program leading to a bachelor's degree or a community/junior college designed to allow for a direct transfer into a four-year program.

Applicants must be pursuing an undergraduate degree or community college program leading to a four-year degree. Through The **Children's Education Scholarship**, children of the fallen, from K-12, can receive a scholarship and educational grants to cover private school tuition and fees, tutoring, after-school programs, summer camps, and other expenses.

College-bound spouses and children can receive the **College or Technical/Trade School Scholarship**. This will cover tuition and fees, books, computers, and living expenses including childcare, tutoring, test preparation services, and career preparation expenses.

Folds of Honor Military Scholarship

Scholarship Award Amount: Up to \$5,000

Application Period: February 1 - March 31, 2025

Eligibility Criteria: Spouses and children of U.S. military members who are KIA, lost a limb, died while on active duty, or who have been classified as having a service-connected evaluation, rated by the VA.

The **Higher Education Scholarship** is for spouses and children who are enrolled or planning to be enrolled in an undergraduate program leading to a bachelor's degree, attending an accredited college or university, or enrolled in an accredited technical or trade school program that results in a certificate or diploma, as long as you don't already have a bachelor's degree The award will subsidize the costs of tuition, school books, fees, on-campus room and board, approved education and tutoring, and other expenses. This award is based on "unmet need" and can be valued up to \$5,000. If a student is going to school on a part-time basis, they would only receive up to \$2,500.

The **Children's Fund Scholarship** helps provide support for dependents ages K-12 for approved and accredited private school tuition, educational tutoring, required books, and school uniforms.

Applicants must be a high school graduate or upcoming high school graduate, or a GED holder, enrolled full-time in a U.S. college, university, or trade school with a minimum 2.75 GPA. Graduate students, as well as those seeking an additional undergraduate degree, do not qualify. The award can be used for tuition, books, incidental fees, room and board, and other direct costs. Amount Awarded: Average amount \$1000

Application Period: Open year round

Eligibility Criteria: The applicant must be the spouse of a service member who served post-9/11/2001 and meets one of the following criteria: active-duty, retiree (including medically retired), 100% disabled veteran, guardsman, reservist, fallen service member, or a 20/20/20 spouse. The applicant must also have or be eligible to hold a valid military/Uniformed Services ID. Eligibility Criteria: The scholarship is available to dependent children and spouses of Navy aviation personnel, including active duty, retired, honorably discharged, or deceased members, both officers and enlisted. Applicants must be high school seniors or currently enrolled in college or a trade/technical school, with the service member having served in Navy Aviation Commands for at least eight years. The scholarships, which average \$5,000 and cover tuition only, are primarily for undergraduate studies, not graduate programs. VA Education Benefits: Fry Scholarship

The Marine Gunnery Sergeant John David Fry Scholarship offers educational benefits to the children and spouses of Armed Forces or Selected Reserve members who died on active duty or due to a service-connected disability on or after September 11, 2001. Eligible children must be at least 18 or have graduated high school and will need to forgo Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) if they choose the Fry Scholarship. Surviving spouses can use the scholarship without losing DIC payments but will lose eligibility if they remarry. The scholarship provides up to 36 months of coverage for tuition, housing, and books/supplies at approved institutions. Tuition is paid directly to the school and recipients receive a monthly Basic Housing Allowance and book stipend.

VA Education Benefit: Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance (DEA)

The Survivors' and Dependents' Educational Assistance (DEA) program provides educational benefits to the children and spouses of Veterans or service members who have died, are captured or missing, or are permanently disabled due to service-connected disabilities. Eligible children can be either married or unmarried but must forgo DEA if they join the military or if they receive a dishonorable discharge. Those receiving Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) must give up those payments to use DEA, though spouses can receive both benefits. DEA offers monthly payments for school costs, on-the-job training, apprenticeships, licensing tests, and preparatory courses. Benefits last up to 45 months for programs started before August 1, 2018, and up to 36 months for those starting on or after that date. Educational and career counseling may also be available.
