



Veterans Integration to Academic Leadership (VITAL)

What is VITAL?

The VITAL initiative is a partnership between the VA Healthcare System and local colleges and universities to support Student Veterans on campus and assists them in completion of their education and healthcare goals. VITAL assists Veterans in accessing and navigating their healthcare services and promotes a positive relationship between Veterans and the entire learning community through campus and community education and training.

How the VITAL Program Can Benefit Student Veterans:

- Provide education on various VA benefits and services Veterans are entitled to as well as assist with enrollment into VA healthcare
- Assist Veterans in accessing and navigating available VA resources as well as community and on campus services to support Veterans' educational success.
- Provide brief counseling services to eligible Student Veterans.

VITAL Eligible Veterans:

To receive ongoing VITAL services eligible Students Veterans must:

- Meet Veterans Health Administration criteria for healthcare services.
- Be enrolled in the VA healthcare system.
- If not eligible for VA healthcare the VITAL coordinator will assist Veterans in accessing on campus and community services.
 - *If a Veteran is not yet enrolled in VA services or needs help understanding eligibility requirements for VA. healthcare the VITAL Coordinator can assist them.*

The mission of VITAL is to provide world-class healthcare to improve the overall quality of life for Veterans, while supporting their successful integration into college and university campuses. VITAL achieves this through seamless access to VA healthcare services and on-campus resources.



ARMY ROTC TWO YEAR PROGRAM FOR GRADUTE STUDENTS BECOME AN ARMY OFFICER IN TWO YEARS!

UIW ROTC is accepting qualified students with at least 60 credit hours to enroll in Army ROTC and take the course as a junior and senior. Or, if you are pursuing a master's degree, you may also qualify! All applicants may be eligible for a full scholarship plus room and board.

Requirements:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Must have 60 or more college hours towards your degree, or be working towards a master's program
- Must be accepted by University of the Incarnate Word
- Must obtain your degree and commission as an officer by your 30th birthday
- Meet Physical and Medical standards
- Agree to accept a commission and serve in the Army on active duty, reserve component or National Guard
- Must have prior service or more than three years of JROTC experience if not, need to attend Basic Camp

Army ROTC Basic Camp:

- Must be completed before enrolling in junior/senior years as an Army ROTC Cadet
- Four weeks of leadership training and team building at Fort Knox, Kentucky
- Free travel and lodging!
- Earn \$1,000 for four weeks!
- Make lasting friendships and learn valuable skills

Potential Scholarships:

- Full tuition and fees!
- ROTC monthly allowance (TAX FREE SPENDING MONEY!!) \$420 per month
- \$1,200 per year book allowance!
- Potential University Incentives free room and board
- Guaranteed job upon graduation approximately \$44,000 per year (not including benefits)
- Worldwide travel and adventures
- Interesting work not the typical 9-5 job!

Commitment:

- An eight-year service commitment to the Army as an Army Officer.
- Chose to serve in one of twenty-four branches in the Army! Including Medical Corps, Nurse Corps and more!
- You can either serve all eight years in the reserve components of the Army, or four years active and four years reserve

Meals for Vets

is a program that provides student veterans who have low income with free daily meals.

Getting through school is hard enough without the stress of not knowing if you'll be able to afford to eat. Meals for Vets and the University of the Incarnate Word have partnered up to make sure you can get a daily meal to help fuel your success.

To qualify:

- Must have served at least 180 days federal active duty
- Provide proof of service (such as DD-214)
- · Provide proof of all household income and benefits
- Meet low income qualifications



PEER ADVISORS FOR VETERAN EDUCATION (PAVE) A Peer Support Program for Student Veterans

PAVE is a peer support program that connects incoming student veterans with student veterans already on campus in order to help them navigate college life, identify challenges they face, refer the student to appropriate resources on or off campus, and provide ongoing support toward academic and personal goals. UIW is one of three colleges in Texas, and one of 47 throughout the country, to have been awarded the PAVE program.

The goals of the program are to:

- · Ease the transition from military to university life.
- · Improve student veterans' sense of connectedness to the university.
- Create a safe haven and source of support.
- Identify mental health issues and other concerns in a timely fashion and connect student veterans with appropriate resources.
- · Improve student veteran academic performance.
- Increase student veteran retention rates.
- · Advisors sharing their own experiences of the university.

Activities:

- · Meet and greets and socials to connect with other student veterans.
- Networking.
- Career readiness
- Special guest speakers.
