Veterans Integration to Academic Leadership (VITAL)

What is VITAL?

The VITAL initiative is a partnership between the VA Healthcare System and local colleges and universities to support student veterans on campus and assist them in completion of their education and healthcare goals. VITAL assists veterans in accessing and navigating their healthcare services and promotes a positive relationship between veterans and the entire learning community through campus and community education and training.

How the VITAL Program Can Benefit Student Veterans:

- Provide education on various VA benefits and services veterans are entitled to as well as assist with enrollment into VA healthcare.
- Assist veterans in accessing and navigating available VA resources as well as community and on campus services to support veterans' educational success.
- Provide referrals for brief counseling services to eligible Student Veterans.

VITAL Eligible Veterans:

To receive ongoing VITAL services, eligible student veterans must:

- Meet Veterans Health Administration criteria for healthcare services.
- Be enrolled in the VA healthcare system.
- If not eligible for VA healthcare, the VITAL coordinator will assist veterans in accessing on-campus and community services.

olf a Veteran is not yet enrolled in VA services or needs help understanding eligibility requirements for VA healthcare, the VITAL coordinator can assist them.*

How the M2VA Program Can Benefit You:

- Dedicated staff provides a seamless transition as servicemembers move from active duty to veteran status by collaborating with DOD and VA services.
- Case management for eligible post 9/11 veterans including coordination of medical care and other services.

Case management assistance includes, but is not limited to:

- Orientation to VA Healthcare
- Navigating VA Healthcare and Veterans Benefit Administration services
- Referrals to VA and community resources

Did you know as a student veteran you may qualify for free meals?

Meals for Vets
is a program that provides
student veterans who have low income
with free daily meals.

Getting through school is hard enough without the stress of not knowing if you'll be able to afford to eat. Meals for Vets and the University of the Incarnate Word have partnered up to make sure you can get a daily meal to help fuel your success.

To qualify:

- Must have served at least 180 days federal active duty
- Provide proof of service (such as DD-214)
- Provide proof of <u>all</u> household income and benefits
- Meet low income qualifications

ARMY ROTC TWO-YEAR PROGRAM

BECOME AN ARMY OFFICER IN TWO YEARS!!

STMU ROTC is accepting qualified students with at least 60 credit hours to enroll in Army ROTC and take the course as a junior and senior. Or, if you are pursuing a masters degree, you are also qualified! All applicants may be eligible for a full scholarship plus room and board.

Requirements:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Must have 60 or more college credit hours towards your degree, or be working towards a
 master's degree
- Must be accepted by the University of the Incarnate Word
- Must obtain your degree and commission as an officer by your 30th birthday
- Meet physical and medical standards
- Agree to accept a commission and serve in the Army on Active Duty, Reserve Component, or National Guard
- Must have prior-service or more than 3 years of JROTC experience if not, need to attend Basic Camp

Army ROTC Basic Camp:

- Must be completed before enrolling in junior/senior years as an Army ROTC Cadet
- Four weeks of leadership training and team building at Fort Knox, Kentucky
- Free travel and lodging
- Get \$900 for four weeks
- Make lasting friendships and learn valuable skills

Potential Scholarships:

- · Full tuition and fees
- ROTC Monthly Allowance (TAX FREE SPENDING MONEY!!) \$420 per month
- \$1200 per vear book allowance
- Potential University incentives free room and board
- Guaranteed job upon graduation approximately \$44,000 per year (not including all benefits)
- Worldwide travel and adventures
- Interesting work not the typical 9-5 job!

Commitment:

- An eight-year service commitment to the Army as an Officer
- Chose to serve in one of 24 branches in the Army, including Medical Corps, Nurse Corps, and more
- You can either serve all 8 years in the Reserve components of the Army, or 4 years active- 4 years reserve


