Dr. Thomas Evans began his service as President of the University of the Incarnate Word on July 31, 2017. UTW is the largest Catholic University in Texas and the fourth-largest private University in the state. The enrollment of 10,389 students reflects the diversity of South Texas, as more than 60 percent of the students are from racial or ethnic minority groups. Dr. Evans served as president of Carroll College in Helena, Montana, from 2012-2017. During his time at Carroll, he developed and implemented a strategic plan, Vision 2018, oversaw a budget of \$55 million, and developed and led several comprehensive fundraising campaigns in excess of \$45 million dollars. Prior to his time at Carroll College, Evans served at St. Edwards University in Austin for 16 years; having risen through the ranks in various roles ultimately to associate vice president of professional education and global initiatives. Dr. Evans holds a Master of Arts in Asian studies and a Ph.D. in higher education administration from UT-Austin. He earned a Bachelor of Science in language arts from the School of Languages and Linguistics at Georgetown University.



Jenna Saucedo-Herrera joined the San Antonio Economic Development Foundation (SAEDF) as president and chief executive officer in 2016. She is responsible for advancing the diversification and growth of the San Antonio regional economy through domestic and global business development, workforce development, partnerships and market strategies. Before joining SAEDF, Saucedo-Herrera served as Vice President of Public Affairs and Brand Management for CPS Energy. She is an alumna of St. Mary's University. Saucedo-Herrera serves on community boards and councils, including the San Antonio Chamber of Commerce, Visit San Antonio, Free Trade Alliance, EPIcenter, San Antonio Medical Foundation, Southwest Research Institute (SwRI), and Alamo Academies.



Born and raised in San Antonio, Representative Justin Rodriguez began his career in public service as a juvenile prosecutor for the Bexar County District Attorney's Office, where he worked diligently to assist young offenders in their rehabilitative efforts. In 2004, Rodriguez was elected to the SAISD Board of Education. After serving three years on the SAISD Board, Justin was elected to the San Antonio City Council for two terms. While at City Hall, Justin was an advocate for economic and educational opportunities for the hard-working families of his district. In 2012, Rodriguez was elected to the Texas House of Representatives to serve as the voice of San Antonio's District 125, where he is in his third term. He currently serves on the following House Committees: Appropriations, Pensions, Texas Ports, Infrastructure & Innovation. In addition, he has been selected for the Joint Interim Higher Education Funding Committee.



Rebecca "Becca" Brune is the President and Chief Operating Officer at the San Antonio Area Foundation (SAAF), where she oversees daily management and operations, and development and execution of strategic planning, community investments, and public policy initiatives. Becca has more than 24 years of experience working at the local, national and international levels building public-private partnerships to support innovative programming leveraging community investments. As a trained facilitator and mediator, she has facilitated community conversations around natural resource management issues, economic development, strategic planning and community engagement. Prior to joining SAAF, Becca was Senior Vice President of strategic planning and growth at Methodist Healthcare Ministries, Vice President at Goodwill Industries, and director of family self-sufficiency at the United Way of San Antonio and Bexar County. Throughout her career, she has sought to build innovative, strategic partnerships and promote collaborations to improve programming and inspire systems change.
