The 2024-25 academic year welcomed the first cohort of the **López Scholars**, named for a transformative gift from the Hector and Gloria López Foundation, which fully funded 15 first-generation Latino students' university experiences. Scholars earned places on the Deans' List, took part in conferences, volunteered, and otherwise proved what is possible when doors of opportunity are opened.

Cardinal excellence was also recognized by several organizations. Twenty-three **Graphic Design** students were honored with awards and scholarships at San Antonio's 2024 American Advertising Awards. UIW's **Student Nursing Association** was honored for their outstanding contributions to the nursing field and nursing education by the Texas Nursing Students Association.

Centro Universitario Incarnate Word in Mexico City will be well represented by **Animation and Visual Effects** student Carolina Mostalc Montero at this year's Adobe Certified Professional National Championship.

FACULTY INNOVATION

drives student transformation, creates exciting opportunities and fuels new discoveries that can change the world. A \$1.25 million grant from the Lilly Endowment's Nurturing Children Through Worship and Prayer Initiative is powering "Artful Worship: Inspiring Children's Faith through the Catholic Imagination." Led by Dr. LuElla D'Amico, associate professor of English, and Dr. Sandra Guzman-Foster, director of the Center for Teaching and Learning, the innovative creative arts program engages students enrolled in classes centered on the Catholic imagination to lead ministry arts programming in area parishes and parochial schools.

Triple-negative breast cancer has a foe in Dr. Charles Fermaintt. assistant professor of Biochemistry. A \$500,000 grant from the National Institutes of Health supports his **research** on this aggressive form of breast cancer. The work focuses on identifying compounds from botanical sources with targeted, treatment-like features. It also creates opportunities for students to fight alongside him as part of his research team.

W faculty members are "Enhancing Reading Comprehension in the Era of AI." This multi-tiered Quality Enhancement Plan, or QEP, will incorporate campus-wide initiatives, specialized faculty and peer support, and individualized student support via an AI-supported Reading, Writing and Learning Center. Opening in fall, the center will feature UIW's Academic Reading Assistance System (AI-ARAS), currently being developed by Dr. Chunling Niu, assistant professor in the

Dreeben School of Education.

AI is also at the forefront of discourse at Centro Universitario Incarnate Word (CIW) in Mexico City. Among CIW's many endeavors was an engaging conference on AI and data and a lecture by Monsignor Héctor Mario Pérez Villarreal on "Antiqua et Nova," the Vatican's note on the relationship between AI and human intelligence.

for our Cardinals every day. Whether through exciting new facilities or scholarship opportunities, friends and benefactors are opening doors of possibility.

Exciting progress is underway at the largest renovation project in university history. Founders Hall is a nine-story, 380,000-square foot building on 10 acres that will soon house programs from the School of Media and Design, the School of Mathematics, Science and Engineering, and the Liza and Jack Lewis Center of the Americas. Transformative gifts and pledges toward Founders Hall include \$5 million from the Elma Dill Russell Spencer Foundation managed by the family of Jack Lewis III, former board chair. Current Trustee and CEO of Joeris General Contractors, Gary Joeris, supported with a \$500,000 gift toward renovation. And, Founders Hall's Cheever Auditorium is named in honor of the family of Jane Cheever Powell in gratitude for her gift of \$1.25 million.



The **Stonegate Pharmacy Sterile Compounding Lab** is the newest renovated space at the Feik School of Pharmacy thanks to a leadership gift from Stonegate Pharmacy. The lab now houses new state-of-the-art equipment and tools to support training.



A new \$700,000 **endowed scholarship** was also established this year benefiting future undergraduate students of the College of Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences who demonstrate financial need.




The **Tartan Society**, the exclusive philanthropic giving society dedicated to UIW Athletics, nearly doubled its membership this year.


