3 Credit hour classes: \$90 plus supply fees

Textiles Basics: June 14 1- 4PM (3 hours)

The course presents the differences between natural and synthetic fibers; basic weave and knit structures; and how to help students shop for fabrics that are appropriate for their apparel classes and tech pack development.

Fee: \$20 for fabrics

Organization of the Fashion Industry: June 15 1- 4PM (3 hours) Available Online or Face to Face

The course presents how the industry is organized from manufacturing to retailing. Included are how the industry is aligned by pricing strategies used by retailers.

The Multi-Channel Shopping Experience: June 16 1-4PM (3 hours) Online

The course presents how the online and in-store shopping experiences are integrated; emerging retail business formats; and shopping habits aligned by generational preferences.

Apparel Product Development: June 14 & 15, 9AM - 12PM (6 hours)

Developing garments involves more than just sewing. This course will examine the apparel supply chain process in our digital era beginning with the fiber production, the yarn manufacturing, the textile production, apparel manufacturing, the retailer and ending with the customer. Tips on how to incorporate apparel product development in your classes will be covered. You will work in a team to complete a “hands-on” project that can be used in your classroom.

Supplies needed: Notebook, pen, pencil, scissors

Basic Pattern Re-Sizing: June 17 & 18, 1 – 4PM (6 hours)

Learn how to re-size a pattern (within reason). Many patterns can be changed by one or two sizes if you know how to make the appropriate changes. This particularly useful when students buy the wrong size pattern or when working with donated patterns.

We will spend ½ a day learning how to adjust basic patterns and ½ a day trying your skills on a pattern of your choice.

Supplies needed: ruler, pencil, eraser, scotch tape, paper scissors, and a pattern that confuses you.

Construction Skills: June 21 & 22, 9 AM – 12 PM (6 hours)

Bring your pressing construction problems students have provided over the years. We will review more challenging seams and when to use them, a variety of closures, facings & linings, and any other questions you may have.

Supplies needed: pencil, eraser, notebook, scissors, tape, scrap fabric, sewing tool kit with your sewing supplies.

Creating a pattern from your favorite garment: June 21 & 22 1 – 4PM (6hours)

Do you have a favorite garment that you wish you could recreate? In this class, you will learn how to create a pattern for your favorite garment. The first day, bring a simple favorite garment to learn the basics. The second class, you will spend creating patterns for other favorite garments.

Supplies needed: pencil, eraser, notebook, scissors, tape, large roll of paper, sewing tool kit with your sewing supplies

Fashion Design Bootcamp: An In-Depth Course in Teaching Design: June 16 – 18, 9 – 12AM

Good designers are born, not made, right? Nope. Learn how to break down designing for anyone who is interested! In this class, we will warm up by learning how to break down existing designs through the elements and principles of design. On day 2, we break down the design process to evaluate the target customer and trends. Finally, we will spend the last day learning new tools to generate loads of designs. Be ready to work your brain. Now drop and give me 50 (designs)!

Supplies needed: sketchbook and pencil
