The University of the Incarnate Word recognizes the Greek-Letter Community as an integral part of the institution's educational mission. Greek organizations and UIW share the responsibility of cultivating an environment which enriches the college experience while meeting the core values of the mission. These core values are faith, service, innovation, truth, and education.

University Events and Student Programs (UESP) strives to create a supportive environment for fraternity and sorority organizations on campus. With the development of these *Greek Cardinal Principles (GCPs)*, UESP will be able to illustrate the successes of individual chapters. The GCPs add an additional level of commitment from both the Greek life community and University Events and Student Programs. The principles will not only serve as benchmarks of accomplishment for the chapters, but will also assist in the development of any organization that has not achieved those principles.

The Greek Cardinal Principles were created with several goals in mind:

- To generate mission and vision statements for the Greek Community
- To foster Greek Unity
- To strengthen Greek Chapter Management
- To foster a presence of UIW Greek Life on and off campus
- To develop recommendations for changes regarding current policies, practices, and programs as well as a timeline for such initiatives
- To develop and execute assessment initiatives that accurately capture the current state of the Greek Community

In addition to the *Greek Cardinal Principles*, chapters are expected to comply with all local, inter/national organization policies, all appropriate council governing documents, the UIW Code of Conduct, UIW Student Organization Handbook, as well as any additional requirements put in place by Campus Life and University Events and Student Programs.

4. Chapter Management

In order to grow Greek Organizations, each chapter is expected to conduct its internal affairs in a responsible and effective manner. UESP will provide as many resources as possible to assist this goal. In exchange, all chapters should utilize their resources in order to make decisions that will positively impact the operations of their organization at present and future.

5. Campus Involvement

College learning also happens outside the classroom; being involved in student organizations and university activities can connect students with similar interests and is also a great way to meet new people. Students who are involved on campus have the opportunity to connect with the university in a new and different way. Studies show that students engaged in the campus community are shown to have a more positive collegiate experience.



Greek chapters that achieve certain benchmarks of success based on completion of GCPs will receive a series of incentives. Chapter presidents will receive a report halfway through the year notifying them of their chapter's progress. The program will run through the end of the spring semester.

- Chapter of Achievement Flag to be displayed at events
- Campus Recognition

- Recognitions will be received no later than August of year achieved.

CHAPTER OF PROMISE (11+ ITEMS ACHEIVED)

Fraternities/Sororities who achieve *Chapter of Promise*:

- Letter regarding chapter standing from UESP sent to headquarters, national and/or alumni board
- Recognitions will be received no later than August of year achieved.

CHAPTER IN PROBATION (10 OR LESS ITEMS ACHEIVED)

Fraternities/Sororities who achieve *Chapter in Probation*:

- Letter regarding chapter standing from UESP sent to headquarters, national and/or alumni board
- Presidents of *Chapters in Probation* will meet with Assistant Director of University Events and Student Programs to determine an action plan to advance into Chapter of Promise or further.
- Two consecutive years in Chapter in Probation may result in dismissal of organization from campus.

Related Information

- There may be opportunities throughout the year to earn bonus GCP credit. UESP will notify organizations of bonus credit as soon as information is available; these opportunities may come on short notice.
- Attending events will not count towards credit for two or more items simultaneously.
- There will be NO EXCEPTIONS to documents submitted after the scheduled deadlines.
- Violations to university policies, student code of conduct, and/or student organization handbook may result in retrieval of earned items.
- Items will not be counted towards GCPs if that item was met due to requirements from an individual or chapter improvement plan as a result of a judicial or UESP investigation.
