

ADDENDUM I

THE UNIVERSITY OF THE INCARNATE WORD (UIW) AND UNIVERSIDAD DE MONTERREY (UDEM)

THE PARTIES:

The Vice President of the International Affairs Office on behalf of the University of the Incarnate Word, San Antonio, Texas, United States of America, hereinafter referred to as UIW.

The Director of International Programs on behalf of Universidad de Monterrey, Monterrey, Mexico, hereinafter referred to as UDEM.

INTRODUCTION:

The parties entered into an academic agreement for Academic Exchange and Cooperation on December 6th, 2001. Both parties agree to expand the original academic agreement by introducing Addendum I for the purpose of furthering cooperation and increasing access to high quality education.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of Addendum I is to establish an articulation agreement for UDEM students wishing to earn a Government degree in Comparative Politics/International Relations with a Minor in History from UIW.

The articulation agreement hereinafter shall be referred to as The Program.

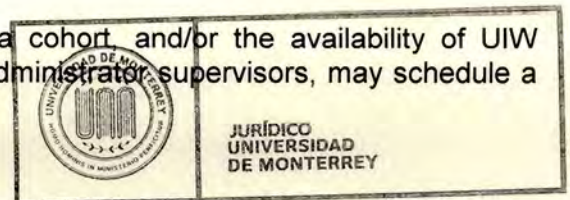
ADMINISTRATION OF THE AGREEMENT:

Both parties agree to exchange course outlines and syllabi (electronic and hard copies) pertaining to The Program before fully implementing and promoting The Program for the purpose of the academic and administrative supervisors to analyze and obtain the official approval from corresponding institutional offices (i.e., Provost, Registrar's Office, etc.).

Both parties agree to update one another, in writing, regarding any changes in the curriculum that may affect participants enrolled in The Program. Furthermore, academic supervisors of The Program shall visit every two years in order to apprise and discuss any proposed and/or implemented curriculum changes. All changes shall be communicated and approved by both parties before implementing any changes, updates, and/or modifications to The Program.

AGREEMENT:

1. UDEM students enrolled in the International Studies Academic Program (Licenciado en Estudios Internacionales) shall be selected by UDEM to apply to The Program. UIW will review and admit candidates who have successfully satisfied the requirements set forth in this agreement.
2. UDEM shall determine, at its own discretion, the application and admittance procedures, dates and requirements for its International Studies Academic Program candidate students enrolled at UDEM in Monterrey, Mexico.
3. Dependent on student demand, number of participants in a cohort and/or the availability of UIW professors, UIW in collaboration with UDEM academic and administrator supervisors, may schedule a



UIW professor to teach specific a course(s) during a summer session at UDEM, Monterrey, Mexico. Any and all arrangements, including financial, shall be discussed and approved in writing by the supervisory deans before the implementation of the course(s).

4. Students must fulfill at UDEM the course requirements set in the Official Degree Plan in order to participate in The Program. There is not a semester requirement to start The Program, although it is highly recommended to do so in their third year of studies. Students wishing to transfer to The Program before completing the required courses, as set forth in this Addendum, shall be reviewed on a case by case basis by both the administrative and academic program supervisors. The supervisors reserve the right to deny or delay student's admittance into The Program until all specified courses and/or requirements are fully satisfied. Fourth and fifth year students will be allowed to do the internship and thesis (Proyecto de Evaluación Final) requirement set by UDEM for graduation along with The Program. These activities are not part of The Program, but they will be allowed so that students do not delay their graduation.
5. UDEM International Studies students can start The Program in the fall or the spring semester. In order to complete their coursework, they are required to stay at UIW for three (3) terms plus a summer. Students will remain matriculated at UDEM for the entire duration of The Program and they must comply with the International Programs Office requirements for study abroad.
6. The coursework completed at UIW will be transferred towards the International Studies Academic Program at UDEM, after previous negotiation with and approval by UDEM's Program Director. UIW will send to UDEM the transcripts of all the participating students in The Program for this purpose.
7. Upon completion of The Program, UDEM International Studies students will be awarded with the Bachelor of International Studies from UDEM and the Government Degree in Comparative Politics/International Relations with a minor in History from UIW (undergraduate level). The UIW degree will be awarded once UDEM confirms that the student has fulfilled all the academic and administrative requirements set by UDEM for graduation.
5. Accepted UDEM International Studies students into The Program at UIW shall have:
 - 5.1. successfully completed the courses stated on the Official Degree Plan titled Government Degree in Comparative Politics/International Relations with a minor in History found on pages 6-8 on this agreement;
 - 5.2 earned a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) of a 2.5 and above;
 - 5.3. satisfied the requirements set forth in the University of the Incarnate Word's Catalogue for international and exchange students;
 - 5.4. satisfied and specifically adhered to the following language requirements:
 - TOEFL: 550 pbt; 213cbt;79 ibt
 - TOEIC: 650 and above
 - IELTS: 6.5
 - 5.5 satisfied immigration requirements established by the United States of America;
 - 5.6. adhere to the rules, regulations, procedures and the UIW student code of conduct while participating in The Program.



INTERNATIONAL ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

As there are a number of components to the international admissions application, the timing of the submission the application is critical. Students are strongly advised to visit with the Academic Supervisors of The Program and apply as early as possible to ensure a smooth application process. All International students, including candidates to The Program, must apply to UIW by the following dates:

Application Deadlines:

An application is considered ready for decision when it contains the following:

Required Elements

- Completed International Student Application for Admission
- Twenty (\$20.00) U.S. Dollar Application Fee
- Signature Document (only needed if completing online application)
- Immigration and Financial Declaration documents
- Copy of passport and any visa held for the U.S.
- 2 letters of recommendation
- Proof of Meningitis Vaccination, if under 22 years of age
- An official Transcript from the University Granting the Highest Degree
If the original transcript is not in English, a certified English translation must be submitted with the original document.
- An official transcript (in English) from all universities attended, reflecting all undergraduate-level work completed.
- English requirements as stated on statement 3.4.

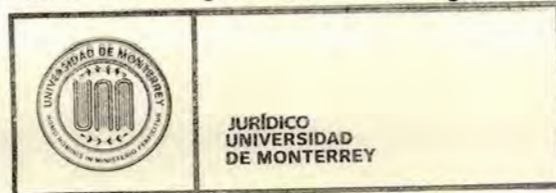
PARTICIPANTS:

Subject to the availability of suitable candidates, UIW and UDEM will agree to accept a specified number of qualified candidates each year. The number of students accepted shall be determined by factors such as classroom and on campus housing availability (if applicable).

FINANCIAL AGREEMENT:

International Affairs students of UDEM shall pay UIW regular tuition, minus 20% (USD), per semester. Students will be responsible for all other fees (i.e., room & board, student fees, international health insurance, student visa, etc.). As UIW tuition increases in the future, so shall the tuition paid by UDEM students. The fees correspond to the three full academic terms and one summer session to be taken by the students at UIW in San Antonio, TX. The tuition reduction rate only applies to students attending The Program at UIW in San Antonio, TX; therefore, students participating/attending other programs, branches, and/or centers will pay regular tuition.

The Program is independent of the Sister School Agreement signed on December 6, 2001. UDEM students who attend (or currently attending) UIW as an exchange student (tuition free) and apply and are accepted (during/after the exchange period) to The Program shall be charged the retroactive regular tuition, minus 20% (USD), per semester, as per this agreement. As such, students enrolled in The Program shall be categorized as international students and not exchange students.



ACCOMODATION:

Participants of The Program shall be categorized as international students; therefore, may have the option to reside on campus or live outside of campus, at their own expense. Other fees, such as, but not limited to, course and student fees will be applicable.

DURATION OF THIS AGREEMENT:

The duration of this Agreement shall be ten (10) years, starting from the date on which the last signature is given. Its term shall automatically be extended for the same original period of time, unless any party gives a prior written notification six months before the expiration of this agreement.

TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT:

Either party upon six months written notification may terminate this Agreement. The termination of Addendum I shall not, under any circumstances, affect the completion of any students who are currently enrolled and/or have officially been accepted in The Program.

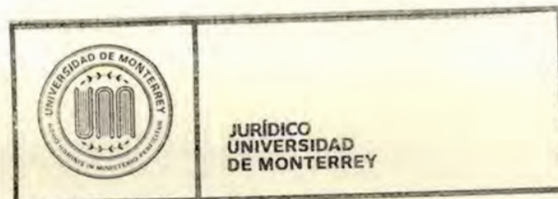
ACCREDITATIONS:








PROTECTION OF PERSONAL DATA INFORMATION:

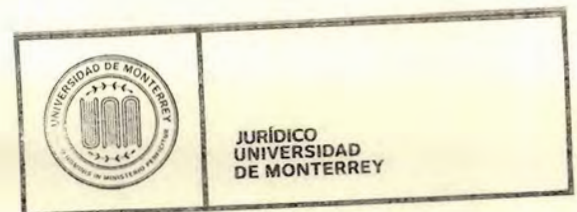
